

PROJECT ARCHAEOLOGY

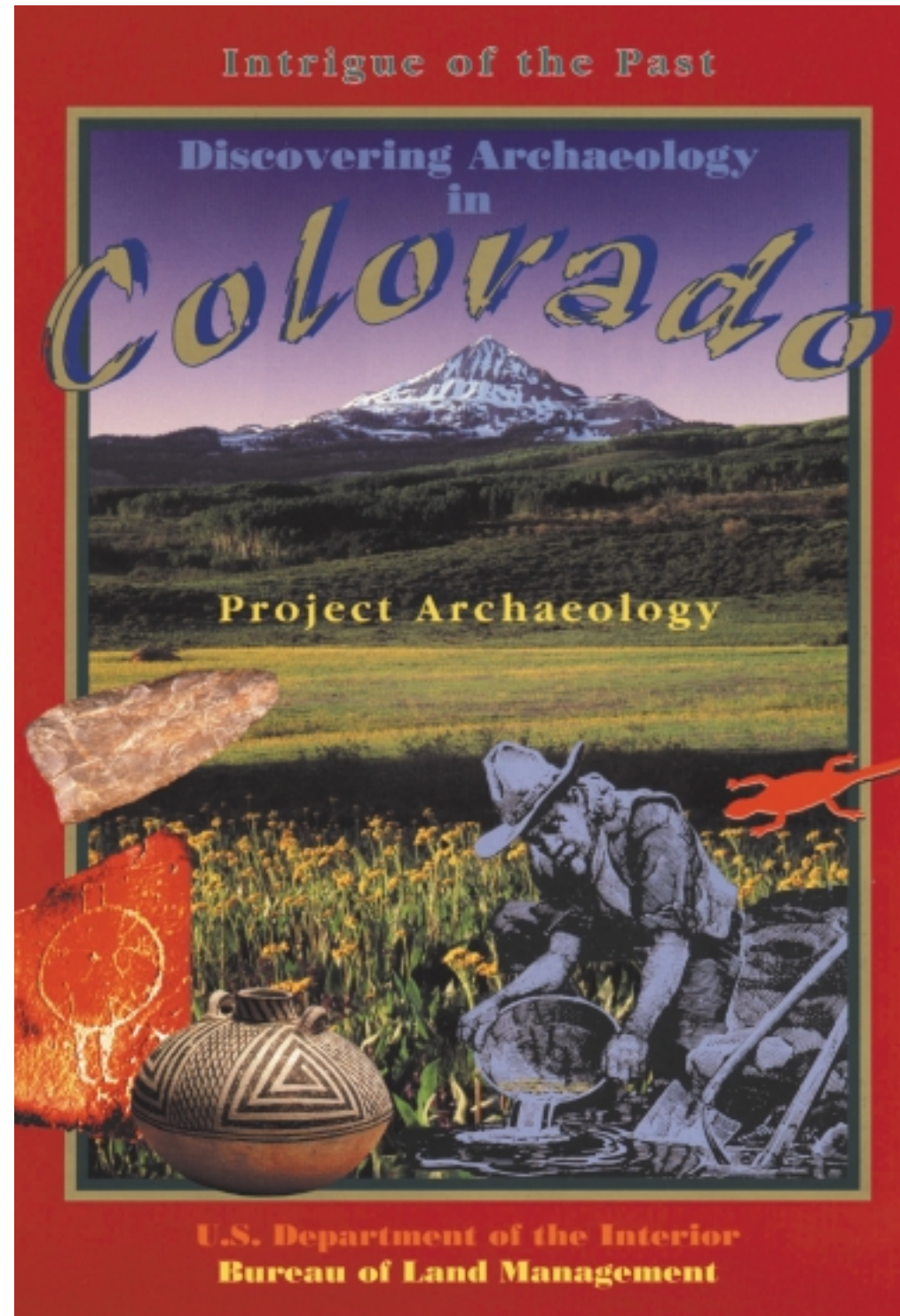
